> THE COURT: So noted, and thank you, Counsel.

MS. HOWARD: The witness?

THE COURT: Hmm?

MR. BRATT: Hmm?

MS. HOWARD: The calling of the witness.

MR. BRATT: Uh, we could do that now or we can do it before you call the witness. Either way you're gonna' make a proffer.

MS. HOWARD: Okay, we won't do it now. Okay, we'll wait, okay.

(Counsel returned to the trial tables and the following occurred:)

(Husher turned off.)

MS. ZOIS: May it please the Court?

THE COURT: You may proceed, please.

MS. ZOIS: Good afternoon. It's been a long morning, congratulations. Um, all drivers have a duty to pay attention to the traffic in front of them. We have these safety rules to help keep our community safe. And when a driver fails to pay attention to the traffic in front of them they're responsible for the harms and losses that they've caused to someone that they've injured.

Back on June 26th of 2009 Kelsey Sapp was home with her younger sister and two of their friends. They decided

they wanted to go to the Outback Steakhouse that night for She took her mom's keys, got into her car and headed dinner. towards Frederick. She was in the left hand land heading westbound towards the Outback. It started to rain, it started to get foggy. She didn't realize that traffic was at a complete stop up ahead of her. Suddenly she saw the brake lights of a blue Honda directly in front of her. She slammed on her brakes, hydroplaned and crashed into the back of the blue Honda. Jacqueline Exline-Hassler was in the blue Honda. She was shook in the car, slammed up against the left hand door of the car, and she'll tell you that the impact was so severe that it felt like her teeth shook. The axel, that doesn't look at that bad, the axel of her car was broken because of the impact. Her car wasn't drivable from the scene and it had to be towed.

The Defendant's car also broke an axel, and her front dri (sic), that's the front driver's side wheel nearly came off the car. Both of the vehicles had to be towed from the scene. There was significant property damage to both of the vehicles. The Defendant's vehicle was \$7500 and change to be repaired. The Plaintiff's vehicle was over \$5000 to be repaired.

During the crash Jackie's back was wrenched. what ended up happening, and I'll come back to this in a second, but what ended up happening was the discs between her

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REDERICK, 15 vertebrae were sheared, because of the force. And she ended up develing (sic) what are, developing what are called annular tears in the discs in her back from the force, and I'll come back to that in a second. But first, let me tell you who we're suing and why. Jacqueline Exline-Hassler is suing Kirsten Sapp for not paying attention to the roadway, failing to operate her vehicle at a speed under the weather conditions as appropriate, and not paying attention to the traffic in front of her.

Kirsten Sapp has pled guilty in court, and this is her transcript from her District Court hearing.

(Audio recording being played.)

FEMALE VOICE: So, um, what is your, what is your name and plea (unclear - two words)?

MS. SAPP: Kirsten Sapp, I plead guilty to (unclear).

FEMALE VOICE: Um, you ladies are not going to testify. You (unclear - three words) you can just (unclear - one word). Thank you. right, what is your (unclear - one word)?

MS. SAPP: Um, it had just started raining on the highway, and by the time I realized the person in front of me was (unclear - four words) I hit 'em.

> FEMALE VOICE: You slide into them?

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MS. SAPP: Yeah, my car just, I didn't even know if I hit the car (unclear - two words).

(End of audio recording.)

MS. ZOIS: Could you hear that? Okay. After pleading guilty in court she also answered a set of interrogatories initially back in June of 2012. And we asked her in that set of interrogatories . . . are you claiming that the Plaintiff did anything wrong in this case? Are you claiming that Jacqueline Exline-Hassler did anything to cause or contribute to this occurrence, and her answer back in June of 2012 was, "I make no such," I believe that was probably misspelled, but "contention."

In December of 2012, however, Kirsten Sapp, under new representation has said, "The Plaintiff was contributorily negligent for suddenly and unexpectedly stopping in the roadway." I don't believe that would be the testimony in this case, but I've been surprised before.

We are also suing Guido Porcarelli's client who is a different defendant in this case.

MR. GILLCRIST: Objection, Your Honor.
