Is that right? 17 That is right. 18 Α. When you're stopped at the stop sign on 19 0. Road and you're looking to your left, what's 20 your last sight? How far can you see down 21 22 Road?

15	with you. I think most unmarked roads in the county
16	that's not marked are 35 mile an hour.
17	Q. And do you know what the speed limit is on
18	Road?
19	A. I'm not sure. I meant to look. If it's
20	unmarked, it's 35 mile an hour, but if it is marked,
21	it's could be 40.
22	Q. Are there any lane markings on Road,

meaning is there any line separating the right-hand 1 side of the road from the left-hand side of the road 2 . or northbound traffic from southbound traffic? 3 I mean, they tar and chip, sometimes they 4 do have them; sometimes they don't. I can't 5 remember whether they did or not. 6 Okay. And that's -- and if you don't 7 0. remember, that's a fine answer to a question, too. 8 Yeah, I mean that's -- yeah, on that road 9 Α. I'm sure -- I mean I'm not for sure. At the time 10 they might have tar and chipped and a lot of times 11 they don't get them painted for like a year or so, 12 you know, so I'm not sure on that. 13 Road as of th of 14 0. Α, And the way it looks to me from the 19 Q. pictures that I have of the scene is it's a double 20 vellow line approaching that intersection. 21

2	dash through the intersection.
3	A. Right.
4	Q. And then picks up again as a double yellow
5	line on the other side of the intersection. Is that
6	right?
7	A. Yeah, there's like a space there, I guess
8	if you'd want to turn left, you could go up through
9	and turn to the left there, I guess you'd have a
10	spot. I'm not sure when that accident happened if
11	it was like that or not. See, they've repainted the
12	lines and stuff since then.
13	Q. Okay. So, do you remember whether or not
14	there was any markings on Road on th,
15	?
16	A. Yes, there was.
<u>1.7</u>	Q. And tell me what you remember about the
18.	marking on Road on , .
19	A. They was double lines.
20	Q. And do you remember if there was a break
21	in the double lines as you got closer to the
22	intersection?

1	A. I do not remember.
2	Q. But you remember some portion of Road
3	had double yellow lines?
4	A. Oh, yeah, on up around where the accident
5	was, there was double lines.
6	Q. Okay. Did the impact take place at a part
7	of Road where there are double yellow lines?
. 8	A. Well, the motorcycle come over on my side
9	of the yellow lines and struck my pickup.
10	Q. So my question is were there double yellow
11	lines in the area where the impact took place?
12	A. Yes.
13	Q. What was the weather like on th,
14	, around the time of the crash?
15	A. It was a very nice evening, very sunny and
16	bright.
17	Q. Do you remember whether or not you had your
18	windows up or down?
19	A. I'm not sure, ma'am.
20	Q. Do you remember whether or not you had your
21	radio on or off?
22	A. I don't think I had my radio on.

You did have a cell phone at the time of 1 the accident; correct? 2 I own one, yes. Α. 3 Did you have the phone with you in the 4 Q. vehicle at the time of the crash? 5 Yes, I did. Α. б And your counsel was kind enough to 7 Q. provide me with cell phone records from the date 8 of the crash, and your phone number at the time was 9 Does that sound about right? 10 11 Α. You say 12 Yes. Q. Yes. 13 Α. And, looking at the cell phone records, 14 it appears that your last incoming call that day 15 was at 11:51 a.m., and the next incoming call would 16 have been at 6:46 p.m. Does that sound about right? 17 Probably. I would say it was probably 18 calling me back. 19 Do you know what time the crash happened? 20 Q. Somewhere between 6:30 and ten till seven, 21 probably, somewhere in there. I mean officers --22

I mean, I'm not sure exactly but in that range. 1 So, somewhere between 6:30 and 6:50, ten 2 3 till seven? 4 Α. Right. And you said that you think the next 5 calling you back. Is that incoming call was 6 what you think the next cell phone call is? 7 Well, I'm not sure. I mean, unless 8 somebody tried calling me while the accident was 9 going on, but, I mean, I called, you know, the 10 ambulance and all that and his wife. 11 How did you --12 0. But his wife never answered her phone, and 13 Α. she called me back. I'm not sure who called there. 14 How did you call? What phone did you use 15 Ο. to call the ambulance? 16 I think it was my phone. 17 Α. You think you used your phone to call the 18 Q. 19 ambulance? I think. Ά. 20 Did you make any other calls other than --21 Ο. I'm assuming it was to 9-1-1?

1	A. Right.
2	Q. All right. Did you make any other calls
3	other than to 9-1-1-?
4	A. To his wife.
5	Q. Do you know, did you call 9-1-1 first or
6	did you call his wife first?
7	A. Nine one one first. I'm pretty sure on
8	that.
9	Q. And how did you get the phone number for
10	his wife?
11	A. Through , but originally, he did not
12	want to call an ambulance or the law.
13	Q. Okay. We'll get to the conversation that
14	the two of you had at the scene in a minute. When
15	so you're on your way home from the farm, and you
16	get to the intersection of and Road.
17	Tell me what happens as you're coming up
18	Road. Describe what you did with your vehicle.
19	A. I stopped at the stop sign. I turned my
20	turn signal on to the right. I looked to the left.
21	I looked to the right. I looked to the left. Then
22	I turned and proceeded and turned in my lane onto

Road and proceeded on Road. And then at 1 that time, a motorcycle come up over the hill around 2 the turn in my lane and struck the left front of my 3 4 pickup. Let's back up. When you got to the stop 0. 5 , how long were you stopped at the sign on 6 stop sign before you pulled forward? 7 A. Well, probably 30 seconds or, you know, 8 long enough to look the intersection over. 9 When you looked to your left, did you see 10 ο. any traffic coming at all? 11 A. No, I didn't. 12 When you looked to the right, did you see 13 Ο. any traffic coming? 14 No, I did not. 15 Α. When you looked to your left, did you have 16 Q . any difficulty seeing the 500 foot of road to your 17 left because of the sun? 18 No, not -- the sun was more like to the 19 side right here. It was like -- it was like this 20 way, but I could see up the road, I mean, partially 21

up the road up that way.

1	Q. So, when you looked to your left, from
2	sitting at Road, the sun wasn't preventing
3	you from seeing traffic on the road to your left?
4	A. No, but it was really bright right here,
5	like, but I was looking sort of at an angle this
6	way, see?
7	Q. But it didn't impair your ability to see
8	anything coming from your left?
9	A. No.
10	Q. Okay. From the time that you began your
11	right turn so, you're at the stop sign, you put
12	your foot on the gas, you begin to accelerate to the
13	right; correct?
14	A. Correct.
15	Q. How much time passed from the time you
16	pulled away from the stop sign before you saw Mr.
17	's motorcycle?
18	A. Um, I mean, I wouldn't know. I mean,
L9 .	probably maybe two, three minutes.
20	Q. When you first saw Mr. 's
21	vehicle, where was his vehicle in relationship to
10	the dauble rellow lime?

1	A. He came up over the hill on my side of the
2	road in my lane.
3	Q. So, the first just so I'm clear; I don't

5	that you saw his vehicle was when he was coming up
6	over a hill, and he was on your side of the road?
7	A. Right.
8	Q. So he was over the double yellow lines?
9	A. Right, as far as I know.
10	Q. How far away was the front of your vehicle
11 .	from his vehicle when you first saw him?
12	A. I wouldn't know, ma'am, probably 10, 15
13	feet, approximately 10 or 15.
14	Q. So he was pretty close.
15	A. Yeah. I mean fairly close.
16	Q. When you first did you do anything at

L8	A. Basically slowed down or went to stop. I
L9	mean it was just a matter

1	A. I think I hit the brakes. I mean I hit
2	the brakes is what I did. I mean, I don't know if I
3	was completely stopped when he hit or not, but I was
4	close if I didn't wasn't stopped.
5	Q. Can you estimate your speed for me when you
6	first saw his vehicle?
7	A. Um, probably like, approximately 10 to 15
8	miles an hour.
9	Q. Okay So, you've come off from your stop
10.	sign, you've made your right, you're going about 10
11	to 15 miles an hour, so you're still accelerating,
12	having got up to about 35.
13	A. Right, yeah.
14	Q. And you see his vehicle come over the hill.
15	He's 10 or 15 feet away, and your the next thing
16	you did was go from the accelerator to the brake
<u>1</u> 7	A. Right.
18	Q to try and stop.
19	A. Right.
20	Q. Did you try to turn your wheel at all to
21	the right?
22	A. I may have turned a little, I mean, but

I mean he was coming. 1 He was coming, and he come quick. 2 Do you remember whether or not you were 3 able to have time to turn your vehicle to the right 4 at all? 5 I may have turned a little bit to the right 6 Α. to like get defensive, but I know I hit my brakes. 7 When the impact took place, do you know if 0. 8 your truck was stopped or moving? 9 Not for sure. - Q. And, also, in comparison, in looking at the photographs that were taken in August of 2011 using, for example, Exhibit No. 2, page M, those are clearly brighter than in contrast to Exhibit 5, page F as well. Would you agree with that?
- A. I would guess. I don't know whether they -- like I said, they swept and had cinders and stuff over them, you know? I mean I can't tell you.
- Q. Well, in other words, the photographs shown here in April of 2009 has yellow lines that aren't as bright as they're shown in August 11 -- August 4th, 2011 photograph set. Would you agree

with that, generally? 1 Yeah, generally. 2 Α. Do you know how often the County comes out 3 and repaints these lanes or these lines? 4 I can't speak for their garage up there. 5 Α. Our garage, we do it every other year. 6 Every other year the lanes are painted? 7 Ο. They try to. 8 Okay. Did anyone at the scene of the 9 0. crash say anything to you to give you the 10 said anything about having impression that 11 trouble seeing because of the bright sunshine? 12 Had anybody said that to me? 13 Α. Yes. 14 Q. Just, I mean all the fire fighters and 15 everything went on and on about how bad the sun was 16 17 to the west looking at it.
